Credits for Graduation

To earn an HHS diploma, you must earn at least 25 credits.

In addition, you must fulfill the Michigan Merit Curriculum graduation requirements.

Credit Recovery and Summer School are available if you fall short of credits or graduation requirements.



Graduation Requirements

English 4.0 Credits

- → English 9
- → English 10
- → English 11 OR Advanced Level English
- → Senior English OR Advanced Level English

Math 4.0 Credits

- → Algebra 1
- → Geometry
- Algebra 2
- → Senior Year Math

Science 3.5 Credits

- → Biology
- → Chemistry
- → Physics
- → Earth Science (0.5cr)

Social Studies 3.0 Credits

- → World History
- → US History
- → Government (.5cr)
- → Economics (.5cr)

World Language 2.0 Credits

- → Must be 2 years of the same language
- → Can substitute 2nd year 1.0 cr w/ ADDITIONAL VPA or CTE credit

Health 0.5 Credit

Child Development CANNOT be used for Health.

Physical Education 0.5 Credit

Must take Level 1 before taking Level II, and Level II before taking Level III.

VPAA 1.0 Credit

Approved VPAA courses are listed at the end of the Course Guide.

General Electives 6.5 Credits

- → Read Course Descriptions before selecting electives
- → Selections are COMMITMENTS
- → Any course you choose as an elective or alternate can show up on your schedule
- → Schedules will be based on the choices you make; changes will not be made in the fall or at the semester







CO-OP

Work-Based Learning Credit may be earned through CO-OP placements. Students have the option to be released from school early to participate in the work-based learning program. Students must already be employed in order to apply to participate in Co-op. Students are employed by a business that agrees to provide on-the-job training that *correlates with concurrent classroom instruction*. A school coordinator monitors the student's work performance. Students may earn up to 3 credits per year. An informational meeting will be held in May.

- If you are interested in Co-op, you must select CO-OP as an <u>ALTERNATE</u> in PowerSchool.
- <u>DO NOT</u> include CO-OP in your 7.0 credits. Schedules will be adjusted in fall after all paperwork is complete and approved.





STEP 3: Alternates - Click on the Add Alternates drop-down menu. Students must select at least thre alternates, or they will be selected for you. The more alternates you select, the more options you will have when making schedule adjustments in Class Choice, DO NOT SELECT ALTERNATES THAT ARE ALREADY SELECTED UNDER Core or Electives.

Graduation Requirements




You must select all the <u>Core Required classes first</u>, <u>before you will be able to see electives</u>. Likewise, electives must be all selected to the exact credits required <u>before you can see alternates</u>.

Step-by-step instructions to help for entering requests via ClassChoice

Step 1: Log on to PowerSchool with your student or parent account.

Open a web browser and go to https://pschool.howellschools.com/public/

Step 2: Select ClassChoice from the left hand menu in PowerSchool.

Step 3: Enter your Requests.

You should be at the **Requesting Screen** in ClassChoice. There are several steps to entering your requests for next year. At our school it is divided into 3 steps.

Core - REQUIRED class in your grade level

Electives - Personal selections for non-core classes

Alternates - Extra electives (in case there are conflicts or classes are full)

When making your selections please keep in mind that later you will be able to make your own schedule and move classes around. However, you will only be able to select courses that you initially request, so it is important to be accurate and always choose the maximum alternates allowed so that you have more choices later to fill your schedule.

You must select all the <u>Core Required classes first</u>, <u>before you will be able to see electives</u>. Likewise, electives must be all selected to the exact credits required <u>before you can see</u> <u>alternates</u>.

Personal Curriculum Modification

When a student wants to modify graduation requirements, it requires a Personal Curriculum

The most common modifications are to trade one or more of the following requirements with extra Math, Science, English, World Language, VPAA or CTE.

Physical Education (PE)
Health
Economics
Visual-Performing-Applied Arts
2nd year World Language

You <u>must</u> see your counselor. You are required to turn in a <u>Personal</u> Curriculum Form, Four-Year Plan, your EDP and Transcript
