2018 SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS

The Brighton Art Guild is pleased to announce a call for applications for the 2018 Norma Gray \$1000 College Scholarship for the Visual Arts, the \$500 High School Visual Arts Scholarship and the \$500 Ron and Norma Gray Memorial Scholarship. The Longfield Family Charitable Foundation generously sponsors our Norma Gray annual scholarship in honor of founding member Norma's passion and dedication to supporting the creative development of Michigan artists. All scholarships are competitively awarded based upon an applicant's merit and goals in the visual arts. There is no cost to apply.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

All applicants must be between the ages of 17 and 25. All college undergraduate and graduate students who are **full time residents of the state of Michigan are eligible to apply for the Norma Gray Scholarship. All Livingston County high school seniors who are **full time county residents are eligible to apply for the \$500 High School Scholarship, and the Norma Gray Scholarship. All applicants must be attending a Michigan college/university in the fall of 2018. **All applicants meeting the above criteria will also be considered for the Ron and Norma Gray Memorial Scholarship.

HOW TO APPLY

Complete and sign the Scholarship application form and mail it with a DVD or memory stick that includes:

YOUR ARTIST'S GOAL STATEMENT. Your statement should be at least 75 words and should address why you make your art, how you make your art, what it is made of, what your art means to you and what your visual art goals are for the next year, and:

INCLUDE FIVE ARTWORK SAMPLES. Files must be a digital .jpg format (300dpi). The smallest dimension should be 5 inches. All 3D art should show 1 front and 1 back view. Artwork file names should include the artist's name, title, medium and dimension for each sample submitted. (ie: JohnDoe _sunset_acryliconcanvas_18wx22h). Mail your completed application form, and DVD/stick that includes your artist's statement and artwork samples by the deadline Monday, April 2, 2018 to the address noted on the application. Submissions postmarked after midnight April 2 will not be accepted.

NOTIFICATION Applicants will receive notifications via e-mail on or before April 23.

**Definitions: Full-time resident is a person whose main home/primary residence is located in Michigan and/or Livingston County for the entire year.
