

### Steps for Filling out a FAFSA

### Before Starting

#### Get organized.

- Determine your dependency status..
- FAFSA on the web worksheet.
- Search for school codes.
- Students and parents apply for a PIN.
- Check application deadline dates.

#### Filling Out A FAFSA

#### Fill out the application.

- Fill out your FAFSA.
- Open your saved FAFSA or correction application.
- Sign electronically with your PIN.


#### View your results online.


- Check status of a submitted FAFSA or print signature page.
- Make corrections to a processed FAFSA.
- Add or delete a school code.
- View and print your student aid report.







## Early Decision

## Regular Decision

Apps typically due around Nov. Decisions sent out in Dec.

PROS

- An early acceptance letter means the stressful process is over sooner!
- Schools know your commitment, so your chances can be (slightly) increased.



CONS

- An acceptance is binding, and you must withdraw applications from other schools.
- Beware of senioritis: don't let your grades slip just because you got in early!

#### DO THIS IF...

You have one dream school

Apps due sometime in fall Decisions sent out Dec. - Feb.

PROS

- You'll get an early decision, but it's not binding
- You don't need to withdraw your other applications if you're accepted



CONS

 You still have to prepare your other applications, just in case the Regular Decision deadline falls right after decisions are mailed out.

#### DO THIS IF...

You love one particular school, but still want to keep your options open

Apps due between Jan. 1 - Feb. 1 Decision dates vary

PROS

- Later deadlines mean you have longer to perfect your applications
- You aren't committed to any school, so it's perfect if you want to keep your options open



- A large, general applicant pool means stiff competition
- You won't receive a decision until later, so you'll be on pins and needles for longer!

#### DO THIS IF...

You like a lot of schools, and want to weigh all of your options

### School Related Absence Form

- College visits are "School Related" and do NOT count against Class Attendance
- Pre-arranged College visits: obtain SRA-Form from the Counseling Office secretary (or after the visit occurs, complete the form to have the absence excused).

- ★ Deadlines (applications, financial aid, deposits, orientation)
- **★** Essay requirements
- **★** Letters of Recommendation
- ★ SAT/ACT scores (directly from collegeboard.com)
- ★ College visits!
